#### Your support changes lives!

Supporting students through our three priority funds: education, emergency relief, and community investment, help us to serve students holistically. These funds ensure our students are supported and our community is strengthened.



Because of your support, in FY23 the Sunnyside Foundation served 22,050 children, families and educators on Tucson's southside.



1,266 families provided with emergency rent, food, clothing, cash or utility assistance through our Emergency Relief Fund



5,489 students and 30 educators served through our Excellence in Education fund, providing funding for classroom projects, supplies, field trips, scholarships and professional development opportunities



2,000 community members engaged in Community Reinvestment projects including: neighborhood clean ups, school bike clubs, new murals and financial literacy events

We have continued to deepen our impact serving students, teachers, and families in Tucson's southside. In 2022-2023 we served over 22,000 students and families. Wow, we did that together! We are immensely grateful for each of our fervent donors, volunteers, and partners. This work can only exist with each of you by our side.

Together we provided more educational support by providing scholarships to graduating seniors and dual enrollment scholarships for SUSD students to receive college credit. We expanded professional development through Sunnyside CommunityShare, and we continued our legacy mini-grant program for Sunnyside Unified School District educators.

Education and community are at the heart of our existence, and this past year we expanded learning opportunities to go beyond the classroom and out into the community. Thank you for helping us stand up the first ever Community Investment Fund for the southside of Tucson!

We worked with community partners to start new bike clubs in SUSD schools, mural art projects, cafecitos on financial literacy, and neighborhood clean ups. We proudly serve as fiscal sponsors for grassroots projects such as Families United Gaining Accessibility (FUGA), Pima County REACH, and the Gabe Gallegos Memorial Foundation. The work they set out to do in the community aligns and strengthens each of our missions to serve the community collectively.

Investing in Sunnyside Foundation means we create community-centered solutions and plant seeds for big dreams. Together we create a thriving place we call home each and every day.

#### **EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION FUND**









The Excellence in Education fund enhances the educational experiences and opportunities for SUSD students and educators by providing funding for classroom projects, dual-enrollment and college scholarships, and professional development.



5,489 total students served



\$66,000 in scholarship support for graduating seniors



\$14,000 in dual-enrollment student scholarships for UA Biotech program



\$18,600 in support for the Sunnyside CommunityShare Professional Development Program

#### **EMERGENCY RELIEF FUND**

The Emergency Relief Fund ensures SUSD students and families in Tucson's southside who are struggling with economic challenges have easy access to emergency resources from the people they trust most.



887 families fed through food box distributions



229 southside families protected from eviction\*



95 households provided with cash assistance



45 households provided with utility relief



10 students received winter coats and shoes

#### **COMMUNITY INVESTMENT FUND**



The Community Investment Fund is a partnership between Sunnyside Foundation and local organizations to advance equity in Tucson's southside by investing in people and physical infrastructures.



Together we help build a stronger community by facilitating neighborhood clean-ups, art projects, cafecitos on generational wealth, establishing bike clubs in schools, and community bike rides with partner org Families United Gaining Accessibility (FUGA).



Sunnyside Foundation also serves as a fiscal sponsor to grassroots organizations which support youth and families in the areas of mobility, sports, and health.

#### Pima County Health Department REACH COVID Supplement Program

This program was co-created with community partners to establish two multi-media campaigns including Tardeada de Salud and Flu Awareness.

This important program focused on increasing access to vaccines and health resources through Community Advisory Boards and Community Groups in Tucson composed of schools, small business, nonprofits, and community collaboratives.




